- I. **TITLE:** Administrative and Consent Orders issued by Environmental Quality Control (“EQC”).
- II. **SUBJECT:** Administrative, Consent and Environmental Health Orders issued by EQC during the period December 1, 2010 –December 31, 2010.
- III. **FACTS:** For the periods December 1, 2010 through December 31, 2010, EQC issued thirteen (13) Consent Orders with total assessed civil penalties in the amount of \$57,775.00 and six (6) Environmental Health Orders with total assessed penalties in the amount of \$3,250.00.

Unless otherwise specified, “Previous Orders” as listed in this report include orders issued by Environmental Quality Control programs within the last five (5) years.

ANALYSIS: During the reporting period, Air Quality Enforcement entered into a Consent Order with Polydeck Screen Corporation (Respondent). The Respondent manufactures modular industrial screens used in the mining and quarry industries. Violations include failure to maintain records of daily operating times of its frame preparation process and daily inspection and regular cleaning or replacement of dry filter(s); re-location and operation of an abrasive blasting process outside of its permitted blast booth prior to applying for and obtaining Department-issued permits; and exceedance of the 24-hour standards for particulate matter (PM). To comply with the Order, the Respondent must maintain records; obtain the appropriate permits prior to constructing, operating, altering or adding a source of air contaminants; no abrasive blasting is to take place outside of the blast booth; limit hours of operation for frame preparation and manual paint spraying; and, comply with the 24-hour standards for PM. A civil penalty was assessed in the amount of thirteen thousand four hundred dollars (\$13,400.00).

Water Pollution Enforcement entered into a Consent Order with the City of Belton (Respondent), operator of the Ducworth Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP). Violations at the WWTP include exceedance of effluent quality limitations for both fecal coliform and ammonia-nitrogen. The Respondent must submit a corrective action plan outlining corrective actions and activities with an implementation schedule. A civil penalty was assessed in the amount of three thousand four hundred dollars (\$3,400.00).
