








Beach Profile & OCRM CA Jurisdiction





Small Wave Activity (Summer)

- Long-period, small swells move sediment toward shore where it accretes on the berm.
- Wider beach.




Figure A: Typical summer and winter beach and dune profiles.



Larger Wave Activity (Winter)

- Sediment moved away from shore and forms offshore bars.
- Narrower beach.





Figure A: Typical summer and winter beach and dune profiles.

Sand Dune Storm Response






Sand Dune Continuity





Longshore Sediment Transport

- Wave refraction causes water and sand to move parallel to shore.
- Zigzag motion in surf zone.
 - Swash at small angle
 - Backwash straight back down the beach face





Sediment Transport

Bedload Transport

Sediment particles bounce or roll along the shoreface.

Suspended Load Transport

Sediment particles are entrained within the water column.

- Sediment particles are moved by the wind.
- This is the primary process driving coastal dune formation.

Sand Dune Formation

Wide Range of Characteristics

- Dunes can range in height from a few feet to several hundred feet.
- Dunes can range in length from tens of feet to several miles.
- Dunes can be isolated hummocks, linear ridges, or groups of varying sizes and orientations called dune fields.

Sediment availability is key

- Dry sand beach is needed for dunes to form.
- Infrequent inundation.


