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INTRODUCTION

1. About this report

This report is the product of the collaboration between Division of Biostatistics and Health GIS, Office of Public Health Statistics and Information Services (PHSIS) and the Bureau of Maternal & Child Health, South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control. Division of Biostatistics, PHSIS is the data source for Sections I, II, and III (vital statistics); and Bureau of Maternal & Child Health provides WIC and WCS information (Section IV).

Population estimates for the intercensal years were prepared by the Office of Research and Statistics of the South Carolina Budget and Control Board under the Federal-State Cooperative Program of population estimating for local areas.

While some data are presented in three years combined or as a trend for the past 10 years, the majority of this report contains vital statistics data for South Carolina events that occurred in 2004 to South Carolina residents. However, data from the MCH programs (in Section IV) are for fiscal year 2005 or 2006. The purpose of this report is to provide basic reference data for a variety of users.

Beginning in 2004, a new Electronic Birth Registration System (EBRS) was implemented along with a revised certificate of birth. Due to this new system and process, there has been a delay in producing a 2004 birth file. The new 2004 birth certificate contains additional variables as well as modifications of previous variables. This may affect comparisons of birth variables to previous years.

Vital Statistics data including certificates of live births, deaths and reports of fetal deaths and induced abortions are for South Carolina residents only. Live births, fetal deaths and deaths occurring out-of-state to South Carolina residents are also included in this report. Event information is re-allocated to the state of residence through an agreement of interstate transcript exchange.

Statistics for “Other” race group and/or “Hispanic” are not reported in some table series in this report due to small numbers. The federal government considers race and Hispanic origin to be two separate and distinct concepts. A person of Hispanic origin may be of any race. Thus, the tables for Hispanic and other races are not mutually exclusive.

Throughout this data book, “All Races” includes unknown races unless specified otherwise.

South Carolina Community Assessment Network (SCAN) is an interactive data retrieval system for community assessment, planning and health practices. Users can create tables, charts, and maps according to their interests and specifications at DHEC region, county, or zip code level. Birth Certificate Data, Death Certificate Data, and demographics were the first datasets available on the SCAN system. Newer datasets include Childhood Lead Surveillance, PRAMS (Pregnancy Risk Assessment Monitoring System), Pregnancy data, Fetal Death data, Mother's Health and Lifestyle data, Infant and Child Health data, Infant Mortality data, and Cancer Mortality and Incidence data from the SC Central Cancer Registry (SCCCR). Future datasets will include CIQ (Community Information Query), BRFSS, Immunization and other datasets related to Health Services.

Each dataset has a series of webpages related to it: Create a Table, Example, Definitions, Generate a Map, FAQ's, and Links. Viewing each of these pages will

help SCAN users become more familiar with the system and with the datasets. SCAN's animated formulas are an excellent educational tool and additional mapping help pages are linked to all interactive maps.

The "Create a Table" page allows the user to select primary variables of interest for their table's rows and columns. After this basic table structure is defined, the user may continue through the step-by-step process to further specify restrictions on additional variables that they want to include in their output table. Currently, users can generate statistics at the state, county, zip code, and DHEC region level. To supplement these tables, the user can also map these statistics out to the state, county or zip code level.

The "Generate a Map" function (webpage) allows the user to create interactive maps for any of the variables the user has selected. These maps display the statistics that users have selected as well as supplemental reference information such as the location of DHEC region, health facilities, major cities, and street networks. Users can query or ask questions about this data through the mapping interface to determine, i.e., what counties have a population above a certain threshold or how many health facilities are in a specific user defined area.

For select variables in each dataset, the user may click in the output table to view more detailed data. For example, in the Death Certificate dataset, users can "drill" into the causes of death for more detailed information: Cancer --> Leukemia--> Lymphoid Leukemia. Users can specify the type of numerical calculations in their output table. Numerical counts, row or column percentages, and unadjusted or age-adjusted rates are among the user's options. These options vary from dataset to dataset. Once the output table is created, the user can download it and paste the results into Microsoft Excel for further analysis. Downloading instructions are described on the frequently asked question (FAQ) page.

The Good News:

South Carolina has made some progress in maternal and child health, and the improvements include (but are not limited to):

- ◆ Fetal mortality rate declined from 9.6 per 1000 (live births plus fetal deaths) in 2003 to 8.7 in 2004. (p. I-3)
- ◆ Percent of births to mothers under 18 declined from 7.21 per 100 live births in 1995 to 4.6 in 2004 (p. III-2)
- ◆ Teen pregnancy rate among adolescents aged 10-14 years declined from 2.0 per 1,000 in 2000 to 1.3 in 2004 (p. I-11)
- ◆ Teen pregnancy rate among adolescents aged 15-17 years declined from 43.2 per 1,000 in 2000 to 37.0 in 2004 (p. I-12)
- ◆ Teen pregnancy rate among adolescents aged 18-19 years declined from 120.6 per 1,000 in 1999 to 107.5 in 2004 (p. I-13)
- ◆ Percent of live births occurring to unmarried women 18-19 years old declined from 54.8 in 1998 to 45.7 in 2004 (p. III-3)
- ◆ Percent of live births occurring to unmarried women 15-17 years old declined from 75.5 in 1998 to 59.2 in 2004 (p. III-3)
- ◆ Percent of live births occurring to unmarried women 10-14 years old declined from 89.6 in 1998 to 85.3 in 2004 (p. III-3)
- ◆ The number of child deaths (1-14 years old) declined from 206 in 2002 to 193 in 2004. (p. II-13)

Every day in South Carolina, 2004:


On an average day in South Carolina during 2004, there were:

- ◆ 154 live births to South Carolina resident mothers
- ◆ 39 infants born to unmarried mothers.
- ◆ 22 infants born to mothers who smoked during pregnancy
- ◆ 20 infants born with less than 37 weeks of clinical estimate of gestation and 3 of them were less than 32 weeks
- ◆ 16 infants born with LBW (< 2,500 grams)
- ◆ 12 infants born to Hispanic mothers
- ◆ 7 infants born to mothers under 18
- ◆ 3 infants born with VLBW (< 1,500 grams)


South Carolina (Residence Data), 1995-2004, By Race

One-Year Infant Mortality Rates


South Carolina (Residence Data) and US data, 1995-2004

One-Year Fetal Mortality Rates


South Carolina (Residence Data), 1995-2004, (White & Black)

One-Year Neonatal Mortality Rates


South Carolina (Residence Data), 1995-2004, (White & Black)

One-Year Postneonatal Mortality Rates





South Carolina (Residence Data), 1995-2004, By Race




**Percent of Very Low Weight Births Occurring in Level III


**Percent of Women With Adequate* Prenatal Care



Teenage Pregnancy Rates (Ages 10-14)




Teenage Pregnancy Rates (Ages 15-17)

South Carolina (Residence Data), 1995-2004, By Race




Teenage Pregnancy Rates (Ages 18-19)



South Carolina (Residence Data), 1995-2004**













Fig. Live Births and Fertility Rate*, South Carolina (Residence Data), 1995-2004













Section V. Technical Notes

DEFINITIONS OF TERMS

RESIDENCE DATA: Data allocated to the place in South Carolina where the person normally resided, regardless of where the event occurred.

FETAL DEATH: Death prior to the complete expulsion or extraction from its mother of a product of human conception, irrespective of the duration of pregnancy; the death is indicated by the fact that after such expulsion or extraction, the fetus does not breathe or show any other evidence of life, such as beating of the heart, pulsation of the umbilical cord, or definite movement of voluntary muscles. (Definition recommended by World Health Organization in 1950). A fetal death is required to be reported if the fetus has completed or passed the twentieth week of gestation or weighs 350 grams or more. (Weight criteria effective in 1978). Vital Statistics Laws and Regulations 61-19: Vital Statistics, Section 21(a). Heartbeats are to be distinguished from transient cardiac contractions; respirations are to be distinguished from fleeting respiratory efforts or gasps.

INFANT DEATH: Death of a live born infant under one year of age.

LIVE BIRTH: The complete expulsion or extraction from its mother of a product of human conception, irrespective of the duration of pregnancy, which, after such expulsion or extraction, breathes or shows any other evidence of life, such as beating of the heart, pulsation of the umbilical cord, or definite movement of voluntary muscles, whether or not the umbilical cord has been cut or the placenta is attached. (Definition recommended by World Health Organization in 1950). **Heartbeats are to be distinguished from transient cardiac contractions; respirations are to be distinguished from fleeting respiratory efforts or gasps.**

VERY LOW BIRTH WEIGHT: Very low birth weight is a weight at birth which is less than 1,500 grams (3 pounds, 4 ounces), regardless of the period of gestation.

LOW BIRTH WEIGHT: Low birth weight is a weight at birth which is less than 2,500 grams (5 pounds, 8 ounces), regardless of the period of gestation.

MARITAL STATUS ON BIRTH CERTIFICATE:

Unmarried - a birth which occurs to a woman who has never been married or who has been widowed or legally divorced from her husband in excess of 280 days.

Married - a birth which occurs to a woman who has been married or was married within 280 days from conception.

Paternity acknowledgment - gives authorization to list the name of the father on the birth certificate of a child born to an unmarried mother with written consent of the father and mother by means of an affidavit as required by South Carolina Law, Section 44-63-165. For statistical purposes, paternity acknowledgments are included in the "married" category.

MATERNAL DEATH: Death of a woman whose cause of death is assigned to Complications of Pregnancy, Childbirth, and Puerperium (Tenth Revision ICD O00-O99). If death occurred more than 42 days after termination of pregnancy, the death is not considered to be pregnancy-related and is not assigned to codes O00-O99.

NEONATAL DEATH: Death of a live born infant under 28 days of age.

PERINATAL DEATH: Death occurring during the perinatal period (i.e. to a live born infant less than 28 days of age and a fetus that has passed the twentieth week of gestation or weighs 350 grams or more).

POSTNEONATAL DEATH: Death of a live born infant 28-364 days of age.

KOTELCHUCK INDEX: The Kotelchuck Index, also called the Adequacy of Prenatal Care Utilization (APNCU) Index, uses two crucial elements obtained from birth certificate data-when prenatal care began (initiation) and the number of prenatal visits from when prenatal care began until delivery (received services). The Kotelchuck Index classifies the adequacy of initiation as follows: pregnancy months 1 and 2, months 3 and 4, months 5 and 6, and months 7 to 9, with the underlying assumption that the earlier prenatal care begins the better. To classify the adequacy of received services, the number of prenatal visits is compared to the expected number of visits for the period between when care began and the delivery date. The expected number of visits is based on the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists prenatal care standards for uncomplicated pregnancies and is adjusted for the gestational age when care began and for the gestational age at delivery.

A ratio of observed to expected visits is calculated and grouped into four categories-Inadequate (received less than 50% of expected visits), Intermediate (50%-79%), Adequate (80%-109%), and Adequate Plus (110% or more). The final Kotelchuck Index measure combines these two dimensions into a single summary score. The profiles define adequate prenatal care as a score of 80% or greater on the Kotelchuck Index, or the sum of the Adequate and Adequate Plus categories.

The Kotelchuck Index does not measure the quality of prenatal care. It also depends on the accuracy of the patient or health care provider's recall of the timing of the first visit and the number of subsequent visits. The Kotelchuck Index uses recommendations for low-risk pregnancies, and may not measure the adequacy of care for high-risk women. The Kotelchuck Index is preferable to other indices because it includes a category for women who receive more than the recommended amount of care (adequate plus, or intensive utilization).

INTER-PREGNANCY INTERNAL: The time period (in months) between the conception date of this pregnancy and the date of last pregnancy outcome (could be live birth, abortion, fetal death, etc).

INTERPRETATION OF DATA

RACE: Information on race of the mother and father is reported on birth and fetal death certificates, and the race of the decedent is reported on death certificates. Fetal deaths are reported by race of mother. As of 1990, Live Births are reported by race of mother instead of race of child. This change allows South Carolina's birth data to be consistent with the National Center for Health Statistics and other states throughout the United States. For statistical purposes, the tables in this report are based on the broad classifications of "white", "black" and "other".

MISSING RACE: In some of the tables or charts, "All races" category includes record with missing race information, which is not included in any of "white", "black" and "other" category. Thus the sum of "white", "black" and "other" category may be less than "All races" category number.

COMPARABILITY: In order that disease classifications may be consistent with advances in medical science and changes in diagnostic practice, any system for categorizing causes of death must periodically be revised. Major revisions in the International Classification of Diseases (ICD), by which causes of death are classified, occur approximately every ten years, and each decennial revision of the ICD has produced some break in comparability of cause of death statistics. In South Carolina, the Sixth Revision of the ICD was used from 1949-1957; the Seventh Revision for 1958-1968; the Eighth 1969-1978; and the Ninth Revision went 1979-1998;and the Tenth Revision went into effect in 1999.

Prior to 1949, under the first five revisions, cause of death was selected on the basis of priority tables for multiple causes, as set forth in The Manual For Joint Causes of Death. Under the Sixth, Seventh, Eighth, and Ninth Revisions of the International Lists, the cause selected for tabulation has been the "underlying" cause, defined as the "disease or injury which initiated the train of morbid events, leading directly to death." (ICDA, Eighth Revision, 1968, Vol. 1, page xxix).

The introduction of the concept of "underlying" cause in 1949, with the Sixth Revision, resulted in a basic change in classification of death which seriously affects the interpretation of mortality trends before and after 1949. The Seventh Revision was essentially a clarification of the Sixth Revision, but the Eighth Revision introduced some major modifications in classification lists and coding procedures. The Ninth Revision also brought some major changes in classification and coding. However, the Tenth Revision introduced some of the most dramatic changes so far.

In order to make valid comparisons of mortality by cause for events classified by different revisions of the ICD, comparability ratios were developed. Comparability ratios are computed by the National Center for Health Statistics from the results of dual coding of certificates according to the old and the new procedures. Taking the number of deaths classified to a given cause by the Tenth Revision and dividing the result by the number of deaths classified to that cause by the Eighth Revision derived the comparability ratios used with the Tenth Revision. Provisional comparability ratios for the United States as a whole, based on the Ninth and Tenth Revisions, have been developed for a limited number of causes published by the National Center for Health Statistics.

Beginning in 2004, a new Electronic Birth Registration System (EBRS) was implemented along with a revised certificate of birth. Due to this new system and process, there has been a delay in producing a 2004 birth file. The new 2004 birth certificate contains additional variables as well as modifications of previous variables. This may affect comparisons of birth variables to previous years.

RATE CALCULATIONS WITH SMALL NUMBERS: There are variations in all statistics that are the result of chance. This characteristic is of particular importance in classifications with small numbers of events where small variations are proportionately large in relation to the base figure. As an example, small changes in the number of deaths or births in small population areas or in the number of deaths from uncommon causes could result in large changes in these crude rates. For this reason, rates for counties with small populations or other small bases should be used cautiously. In this report, rates are not calculated for places of less than 2,500 population or when the number of events is less than 3 for a particular category, due to the known instability of rates based on small numbers. In the Perinatal Section, 3-year rates are calculated to provide a more stable base for comparison of trends over time.

POPULATION DATA: With the exception of population data by race and population data for selected age groups of teens, the 2000 Census data, provided by the Office of Research and Statistics (South Carolina Budget and Control Board), were used to calculate the rates in this report. Population data by race and for selected age groups were modified.

POPULATION DATA BY RACE: At the time of this publication, population files released by the U.S. Census Bureau contain data for a "multiple race" category and for single race categories (including an "other/non-Census designated race" category). This presents problems for vital rates from two standpoints: first, these population files contain counts of persons with more than one race and therefore are not compatible with vital statistics numerators which contain information for persons by single race category, second , the population files contain the "other/non-Census designated race" category which is not used to calculate vital statistics rates.

In order to provide rates by single race category of 'white' and 'black and other' for South Carolina vital events, a methodology was developed that would regroup the populations of the race categories, 'multiple race' and 'other/non-Census designated race', into standard single race categories. This methodology was developed by the National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS) and the bridged races are returned to the Division of Biostatistics, Public Health Statistics and Information Services.

POPULATION DATA FOR SELECTED AGE GROUPS: For inter-census years, ORS provides estimated population data for South Carolina by age for five-year age groups. It is assumed that the population within each of these age categories is distributed uniformly through out the age interval. Based on this assumption, the population for females 14-17, 15-17 and 18-19 years is derived, consecutively, as follows – (20% of the female population 10-14 years plus 60% of the female population 15-19 years), (60% of the female population 15-19), and (40% of the female population 15-19). Pregnancy data for these teenagers are published annually in the

South Carolina Vital and Morbidity Statistics reports and also in the South Carolina Teen Pregnancy Data Book(s).

In order to provide population data derived in a consistent manner over time, the 2000 population counts for these age groups are determined in like manner. These population estimates, rounded to the nearest 10, and the pregnancy rates are provided in the 'Teen Pregnancy' Section of this publication. The population for these age groups as enumerated by the 2000 Census is shown on pages 288-290.

IMPLEMENTATION OF THE INTERNATIONAL CLASSIFICATION OF DISEASES (ICD)10TH REVISION

The ICD is a classification system developed collaboratively between the World Health Organization (WHO) and 10 international centers so that the medical terms reported by physicians, medical examiners, and coroners on death certificates can be grouped together for statistical purposes. ICD-10 replaces the ICD-9, used with 1979-1998 data.

The purpose of the ICD and of WHO sponsorship is to promote international comparability in the collection, classification, processing and presentation of mortality statistics. New revisions of the ICD are implemented periodically so that the classification reflects advances in medical science.

ICD-10 affects the classification, processing, and presentation of mortality data. Some titles have changed. The total number of categories has doubled as a result of the addition or deletion of terms used to describe diseases or conditions. The transfer of certain diseases from one section to another reflects new discoveries and advances in knowledge on the nature or causes of particular diseases. The addition of separate categories identifies specific diseases or particular complications of diseases that are of growing interest. Additionally, the codes associated with each title have been converted from numeric to alphanumeric entities. The ICD rules for processing mortality data are generally similar but account for some changes observed in mortality statistics.

HOW ICD-10 COMPARES TO ICD-9

The intent of developing new revisions is to incorporate changes in medical knowledge. Compared with ICD-9, the ICD-10 has:

- expanded detail for many conditions (e.g., viral hepatitis has been expanded from ICD-9 code 070, a single 3-digit category, to ICD-10 codes B15-B19, five 3-digit categories)
- transferred conditions around the classification (e.g., hemorrhage has been moved from the circulatory chapter to the symptoms and signs chapter)
- used alphanumeric codes instead of numeric codes (e.g., code for diabetes mellitus was 250 in ICD-9 and is E10-E14 in ICD-10)
- modified coding rules (e.g., the "Old pneumonia, influenza, and maternal conditions" and "Error and accidents in medical care" coding rules have been eliminated)
- modified the tabulations lists (e.g., the US' ICD-10 113-cause list replaces the US' ICD-9 72-cause list)
