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1	PROCEEDINGS
2	MS. SKIPPER: Okay. I'm starting the formal part now,
3	so there's going to be a lot of reading.
4	Good evening. It is now 7:40 p.m. on
5	Thursday, April 19, 2012. This public hearing
6	regarding the Draft Air Permit for an on-site
7	leachate collection and treatment system for
8	the Pinewood Site is now called to order. For
9	the record, this facility is located at 8430
10	Camp Mac Boykin Road, Pinewood, Sumter County,
11	South Carolina.
12	My name is Karen Skipper. I'm the Community
13	Liaison for South Carolina DHEC's Office of
14	Environmental Quality Control. Tonight I will
15	serve as the Hearing Officer.
16	The purpose of this hearing is to provide a
17	formal opportunity for you to give us your
18	verbal and or written comments for the record.
19	To be sure that everyone has the opportunity
20	to be heard, questions will not be answered by
21	DHEC staff during this formal hearing. I
22	would like to point out our court reporter.
23	She will be responsible for preparing a
24	written transcript, which will serve as the
25	official record of this public hearing. If at

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1	some later time you are interested in
2	reviewing this record you may request to see
3	it.
4	The requested Air Permit has not been
5	approved. We recognize that many of you may
6	have concerns and questions regarding this
7	draft permit. The comments you share may
8	provide DHEC staff with additional ideas or
9	thoughts about this draft permit. A decision
10	as to whether or not the Air Permit will be
11	approved, modified, or denied will not be made
12	tonight, during this hearing. All comments
13	received will be considered by DHEC staff
14	prior to making a permit decision.
15	Please note the Draft Air Permit has been
16	written to ensure that the Pinewood Site can
17	construct and operate an on-site leachate
18	collection and treatment system in compliance
19	with state and federal air quality
20	regulations. These regulations are in place
21	to protect human health and welfare and to
22	ensure that air quality standards are
23	maintained.
24	We will proceed in the following order:
25	First, Diana Zakrzwski, Permit Writer with

Southern Reporting, Inc.

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1	DHEC's Bureau of Air Quality, will give a
2	brief overview.
3	Then, I will call on individuals who have
4	indicated on the sign-in sheet that they would
5	like to make a comment.
6	Lastly, I will call on anyone who has decided
7	during the course of the evening that they
8	would also like to make a comment on the
9	record but did not indicate their intentions
10	on the sign-in sheet. Please remember that
11	this time will only be for those who have not
12	yet made a comment during the public hearing
13	portion of tonight's hearing.
14	I will now call on Diana from the Bureau of
15	Air Quality.
16	MS. ZAKRZWSKI: Good evening. My name is Diana
17	Zakrzwski, and I am a Permit Writer at the
18	Bureau of Air Quality. I'm here tonight to
19	present information regarding the Draft Air
20	Construction Permit for Pinewood Site
21	Custodial Trust in Pinewood, South Carolina.
22	The Bureau of Air Quality received a
23	construction permit application for the
24	Pinewood Site Custodial Trust on January 10,
25	2012. A construction permit was drafted to

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1	allow construction and start of operations of
2	an on-site system for, for the treatment of
3	leachate produced by the landfill cells at the
4	site. The leachate treatment system will
5	include medals precipitation, a filter press,
6	and evaporate, a sludge dryer, a slurry dryer,
7	and associated equipment.
8	The technical review process took place in
9	several steps. The emission calculations were
10	reviewed, a determination was made on what
11	state and federal air quality regulations were
12	applicable to the leachate treatment system,
13	and the air dispersion modeling was verified
14	to ensure the pollutants are below the EPA and
15	state health-based thresholds.
16	Technical review determined the following:
17	This facility is considered a minor source of
18	emissions due to the level of potential
19	emissions from the site. Emissions were
20	calculated using multiple safety factors, such
21	as worst-case throughputs and maximum detected
22	concentrations.
23	In order to receive an air quality permit, the
24	facility must demonstrate that they are in
25	compliance with air quality standards set by

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1	the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and
2	DHEC. The Clean Air Act requires the EPA to
3	set National Ambient Air Quality Standards for
4	pollutants considered harmful to the public
5	health and the environment. The standards set
6	our protective of public health, including the
7	health of sensitive populations such as
8	asthmatics, children, and the elderly. These
9	standards also protect public welfare,
10	including protection against decreased
11	visibility and damage to animals, crops,
12	vegetation, and buildings. The Pinewood Site
13	Custodial Trust has demonstrated through an
14	EPA approved air dispersion computer model
15	that the maximum admissions concentrations are
16	below these South Carolina ambient standards.
17	There are no national ambient air toxics
18	standards. South Carolina DHEC air toxics
19	standards, (Standard number eight) requires a
20	facility emitting one or more of the listed
21	toxic air pollutants to demonstrate compliance
22	with the maximum allowable concentration at
23	the fence line and beyond into the community.
24	The Standard Eight air toxics demonstration,
25	including the air dispersion model demonstrate

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1	compliance with this standard.
2	The facility is also subject to Standard One,
3	(Emissions from Fuel Burning Operations), and
4	Standards Four, (Emissions from Process
5	Industries). The Trust showed that the
6	leachate treatment system could meet the
7	emissions limits in both regulations.
8	The permit is drafted to include all
9	applicable requirements, including emissions
10	limits, recordkeeping, reporting, and testing.
11	In order to verify the amount of emissions
12	from the leachate treatment system. The
13	facility will be performing testing on the
14	leachate throughout the system. Leachate will
15	be tested at the tank farm, before the
16	evaporator, and after the slurry dryer. This
17	information will be used to calculate actual
18	emissions from the site.
19	The Bureau of Air Quality has determined that
20	the source, if operated in accordance with the
21	submitted application, will meet all
22	applicable requirements and emissions
23	standards.
24	MS. SKIPPER: Thank you. If you have your comments
25	written down, you can leave them with me

1	tonight, or mail them to DHEC by 5:00 p.m. on
2	Friday 11, 2012, which is the end of the
3	comment period. We will now hear from those
4	who signed up to speak. Before making your
5	comment I would ask that each of you clearly
6	state your name and group you are representing
7	for the court reporter. Normally, I would
8	have you come up here, but I think with this
9	small group as long as you can speak loudly
10	enough that he court reporter can hear you,
11	you can stay at your seat and make your
12	comments from there. Again, if you have a
13	written copy and don't mind leaving them with
14	us please give it to me when you finish
15	speaking. And I have Robert McLeod that would
16	like to make a comment.
17	MR. MCLEOD: Yes, ma'am. I live, well I worked for, I

worked at that land fill for eighteen years. 18 19 I know all about it. I've been there. We had three on-site inspectors checking every load 20 and checking that site every day, every minute 21 of the day. If you're going to put in a 22 system like this, that's well and fine. 23 Ι think it would be good because it takes a 24 liability off the highways, but it also needs 25

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1	to be managed properly, and it needs to be
2	inspected by somebody that's not working for
3	the company, like DHEC. Somebody represented
4	by DHEC, the EPA, or somebody other than
5	somebody that's on the payroll should be there
6	inspecting the site while its operating, and
7	the people that's going to be operating needs
8	to have the proper credentials to know what
9	they doing and what to do when something goes
10	wrong; not just someone hired off the street.
11	That's all I got to say.
12	MS. SKIPPER: Okay. Thank you. Now, I will ask anyone
13	who has decided during the course of the
14	evening if they would also like to make a
15	statement to please raise their hand.
16	Okay. On behalf of DHEC I would like to thank
17	everyone for your comments. The comment
18	portion of this public hearing is now
19	concluded. Written comments are also welcomed
20	and may be given to me tonight or you may
21	submit them directly to DHEC. Please see
22	someone at the sign-in table for assistance
23	with this. All written comments must be
24	received by DHEC no later than 5:00 p.m. on
25	Friday, May 11, 2012, again that date and time

1	is 5:00 p.m. Friday, May 11, 2012. All
2	written comments received on or before this
3	date will be considered as part of the
4	decision-making process.
5	Before we adjourn this hearing, I would like
6	to explain the process DHEC will follow in
7	making a decision on the Draft Air Permit.
8	Following this public hearing and formal
9	comment period, DHEC will make a decision as
10	to whether the Draft Air Permit should be
11	approved, approved with conditions,
12	disapprove, or modified. This decision will
13	be based upon: The review of that
14	consideration of the applicable state and
15	federal air quality regulations, the review of
16	comments made at this hearing in the form of
17	the transcript, the review of all other
18	comments received within the required
19	timeframe, and the consideration of any other
20	pertinent information. The decision is not
21	made by popular vote.
22	A copy of the Notice of Appeals Procedures is
23	on the sign-in table if you are interested.
24	These are the procedures that must be followed
25	if a final review, otherwise known as an

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1	appeal, is requested after a permit decision
2	has been made. Any person has the right to
3	request a final review, or appeal, of any
4	permit decision made by DHEC. This request
5	must be made in writing to DHEC's Clerk of the
6	Board within 15 days after notice of DHEC's
7	decision has been mailed along with the filing
8	fee in the amount of \$100.00. If you
9	indicated on the hearing sign-in sheet that
10	you wanted to receive any future information
11	about the Draft Air Permit for the Pinewood
12	Site, or have been asked to be added to the
13	mailing list through the Pinewood website, you
14	will receive notification of DHEC's decision
15	for the Air Permit by standard US mail or by
16	e-mail. However, if you wish to be notified
17	of DHEC's decision by certified mail, please
18	see Karen Lee or Soraya Purvis near the
19	sign-in table before you leave. If you choose
20	to make your certified mail request in
21	writing, you are asked to do so by the close
22	of the comment period on May 11, 2012.
23	Finally, I would like to point out that you
24	were given a Public Feedback Form when you
25	picked up the handouts at the sign-in table.

We are interested in knowing your thoughts and 1 2 suggestions about tonight's hearing and 3 meeting and how we can improve our efforts. 4 Please take a moment to complete this form and 5 place in the box on the sign-in table as you Any comments or suggestions are 6 leave. 7 appreciated and will be kept anonymous.
