DHEC announces online S.C. Watershed Atlas

DHEC is pleased to introduce the S.C. Watershed Atlas. This user-friendly web application replaces the Watershed Water Quality Assessment reports with a data-rich online tool.

Users can browse through more than 90 layers of the most current watershed information including:

- **Watershed boundaries and descriptions;**
- **Bureau of Water permits and advisories;**
- **Public water supply;**
- **Water quality monitoring stations and assessments;**
- **Water classifications;**
- **Floodplains;**
- **National Wetland Inventory;**
- **County parcels;**
- **National Land Cover Data;**
- **Municipal Separate Storm Sewers (MS4s);**
- **Total Maximum Daily Loads (TMDLs) and more.**



A selection of basemaps, measuring and drawing tools, map making and printing capabilities, search choices, Google 360 Street View and a Help section round out the Atlas.

DHEC, Domtar Paper & others join SmartWay® Shipper Partnership

The SmartWay® Transport Partnership is a public-private partnership between the EPA and freight shippers, carriers, and logistics companies. The primary goal of SmartWay® is to move more freight with fewer emissions, less energy and at lower cost. Because of the air quality and energy efficiency benefits of SmartWay®, DHEC’s Bureau of Air Quality joined as a SmartWay® Affiliate in 2013, and works to promote the program in South Carolina.

Grant funding available for TIGER Projects

The U.S. Department of Transportation is offering \$500 million in fiscal year 2016 Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery (TIGER) discretionary grants available to fund capital investments in surface transportation infrastructure.

Grants will be awarded on a competitive basis for projects that will have an impact on the nation, a metropolitan area or a region. The 2016 TIGER grant program will focus on capital projects that generate economic development and improve access to reliable, safe and affordable transportation for communities.

Eligible applicants for TIGER Discretionary Grants are state, local and tribal governments including U.S. territories, transit agencies, port authorities, metropolitan planning organizations (MPOs) and other political subdivisions of state or local governments.

Applications are due April 29, 2016.

NON-HAZARDOUS SECONDARY MATERIALS RULE ADDITIONS

EPA has added three materials to the list of categorical non-waste fuels under 40 CFR Part 41 Non-Hazardous Secondary Materials. The materials are:

1. **Construction and demolition (C&D) wood processed from C&D debris;**
2. **Paper recycling residuals generated from the recycling of recovered paper, paperboard and corrugated containers and combusted by paper recycling mills; and**
3. **Creosote-treated railroad ties that are processed and then combusted.**

DHEC accepting proposals for recycled rubber paving project grants

DHEC's Office of Solid Waste Reduction and Recycling is accepting grant proposals from local governments for paving projects using ground tire rubber (GTR) in accordance with S.C. Department of Transportation specification 401.2.1.1.

Funding will be considered for the cost differential (i.e., "delta costs") associated with using a GTR modified binder in place of a traditional non-modified binder on an entire road replacement or on sections or single lanes of road replacements. Funding is limited to \$50,000 per applicant and would be in the form of a Grant Agreement between the local government and DHEC.

Grant awards will be for paving performed during the 2016 or 2017 paving seasons.

Regulatory Updates

Bureau of Air Quality

Notice of Drafting: 2015 End of Year Revisions – On February 26, 2016, DHEC’s Bureau of Air Quality published a Notice of Drafting in the State Register, proposing amendments to Regulation 61-62, Air Pollution Control Regulations and Standards and the South Carolina Air Quality Implementation Plan (State Implementation Plan or SIP).

DHEC proposes to amend:

- **Regulation 61-62.1**, Section III, Emissions Inventory and Emissions Statements;
- **Regulation 61-62.60**, South Carolina Designated Facility Plan and New Source Performance Standards;
- **Regulation 61-62.63**, National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP) for Source Categories;
- **Regulation 61-62.5**, Standard No. 2, Ambient Air Quality Standards; and
- **The State Implementation Plan.**

These amendments will allow for the adoption of the federal amendments to these standards put forth from January 1, 2015, through December 31, 2015.

DHEC also proposes to amend:

- **Regulation 61-62.1**, Section II, Permit Requirements;
- **Regulation 61-62.5**, Standard No.1, Emissions from Fuel Burning Operations; and
- **Regulation 61-62.5**, Standard No. 4, Emissions from Process Industries.

These amendments will address periods of excess emissions during startup, shutdown, or malfunction (SSM) events as required by the EPA in response to a national petition for rulemaking and to address a finding of substantial inadequacy (referred to as a ‘SIP call’) (80 FR 33840, June 12, 2015).

DHEC also is proposing other changes to Regulation 61-62 that include corrections for internal consistency, clarification, reference, punctuation, codification, formatting, and spelling to improve the overall text of Regulation 61-62 as necessary.

In accordance with 1976 Code Section 1-23-120(H), legislative review is not required because DHEC proposes promulgating the amendments to maintain compliance with federal law.
