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New and Updated CDC Guidance Regarding Zika Virus

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has released, *Interim Guidelines* for Prevention of Sexual Transmission of Zika Virus - United States, 2016, as a Morbidity Mortality Weekly Report Early Release. These interim guidelines state that sexual transmission of Zika virus is possible, and is of particular concern during pregnancy.

Current information about possible sexual transmission of Zika is based on three reports; one case of probable sexual transmission, one case under investigation, and a report of Zika virus isolated from semen after illness onset. The interim guidelines provide recommendations for men and their pregnant partners and men and their nonpregnant sex partners. Recommendations will be revised as more information becomes available.

The CDC has also released, *Updated Interim Guidelines for Health Care Providers Caring for Pregnant Women with Possible Zika Virus Exposure – United States, 2016.* The updated guidelines include a new recommendation to offer serologic testing to asymptomatic pregnant women who have traveled to areas with ongoing Zika virus transmission. This update also expands guidance to women who reside in areas with ongoing Zika virus transmission and includes recommendations for screening, testing, and management of pregnant women and recommendations for counseling women of reproductive age.
