This decision of the S.C. Department of Health and Environmental Control (Department) becomes the final agency decision 15 days after notice of the decision has been mailed to the applicant or respondent, unless a written request for final review is filed with the Department by the applicant, permittee, licensee, or affected person. Withdrawal of groundwater from the well(s) may be made only as specified in this permit.

### Conditions

- (1) The permittee is responsible for compliance with the Groundwater Use and Reporting Act, Section 49-5-10 et seq., Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, all appropriate regulation(s) promulgated as a result of the Act, and the terms and conditions herein.
- (2) The permittee is authorized for the withdrawal and use of groundwater for industrial use in the amount and under the terms herein specified. Any variance from these terms and conditions may constitute a violation of this permit, which may result in the modification, suspension or revocation of this permit, in whole or in part, and/or the institution of such legal proceedings as the Department may consider appropriate.
- (3) This permit may be modified, suspended, or revoked, in whole or in part, if the Department determines there has been a violation of any of the terms or conditions of this permit or that the water use authorized herein is found to have an unreasonable adverse effect on the groundwater resource and/or other water users, present or potential.
- (4) The permittee shall allow Department representatives to inspect water use or other pertinent records and shall allow entry at reasonable times upon the property from which the water is being taken or used to ensure compliance with the terms and conditions of this permit.
- (5) This permit shall not be transferred to any other person or user except by the prior written approval of the Department. The permittee shall submit written notification to the Department at least thirty (30) days in advance of the proposed transfer. This notification shall include a Groundwater Withdrawal Permit Application completed by the proposed new owner(s).
- (6) The permittee shall submit, on forms provided by the Department, a certified report of groundwater used or withdrawn, sources of water, and the nature of the use, and any other information as required under special conditions, not less than yearly. Such reports shall be required by the 30th day of January.
- (7) The permittee shall develop a *Best Management Plan* for water use and water conservation designed to protect water quality and reduce water consumption. The plan should incorporate reasonable and appropriate conservation techniques, application processes, and alternate sources of water, if available, and maintenance schedule to preserve the integrity and efficient operation of water conveyance system(s).
