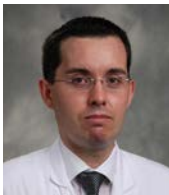


Andrew Asimos, MD

Dr. Asimos is the Medical Director for Atrium Health's Stroke Network. For more than 20 years, his research has focused on how to effectively deliver regionalized acute stroke care, especially across large, integrated stroke networks. He publishes

and lectures extensively on the emergent evaluation and treatment of stroke and TIA. In 2021, he was the recipient of ACEP's National Emergency Medicine Faculty Teaching Award and the Wake Forest School of Medicine Established Investigator Research Award. In 2023, he received the Atrium Health Teal Acorn Career Physician Award.

Dr. MacGrory completed his medical training at University College Dublin in Dublin, Ireland. He then undertook residency in neurology followed by a fellowship in vascular neurology at Yale-New Haven Hospital. Previously, he was on the faculty at Brown/Rhode Island Hospital

for three years before joining Duke in 2020, where he is an Associate Professor of Neurology and Ophthalmology. He also is a staff neurologist at Duke Comprehensive Stroke Center.
