- DHEC will provide a summary response to comments if a permit is issued






Proposed Permitted Area


Green: 50ft buffer adjacent to property line

Yellow: 50ft buffer adjacent to wetlands

Red: Proposed silt fencing

Buffer is defined as setback or areas that will not be disturbed beyond the natural state. Existing vegetation used to screen the operation from public roads in the area.





Proposed Mining Process

- Installation of Best Management Practices (BMPs)
- Clearing of trees and vegetation
- Topsoil removed and stockpiled for future reclamation
- Pit developed and dewatered, as needed
- Sand material loaded and trucked off-site

Reclamation

Reclamation is the planned process for restoring the affected land to a useful purpose while protecting natural resources of the surrounding area.

- Reclamation plan included in application
 - Will be reclaimed to ponds and grasslands
 - Land is sloped and graded during the mining process
 - Stockpiled topsoil used to enhance vegetation
- Reclamation bond is required prior to permit issuance to ensure that reclamation is completed

Truck Traffic Concerns

- DHEC does not regulate truck traffic outside the permit boundary.
 - DHEC can evaluate physical effects of mining, such as blasting or undermining.
- SC DOT, SC Public Service Commission, or Charleston County Department of Public Works have jurisdiction:
 - SC DOT District 6

Hydrology and Groundwater Impacts

Maximum Depth: ~20ft.

Primary Dewatering Layer: Sand/Clay





Hydrology and Groundwater Impacts (Cont.)

- BMPs for sediment and erosion control will prevent additional contribution of sediment to streams, lakes, ponds or land outside the permit area.
- Sediment Control Ponds, along with other BMPs like silt fencing, buffers, and vegetation are designed to ensure water quality standards are met.
- NPDES permit and a CZC Certification must be obtained.

Next Steps

- DHEC will review all comments received (comment period closes August 12, 2022) and conclude the technical review.
- DHEC will make a final permitting decision and provide written notification to everyone on mailing list. A written response to all comments will also be provided if a permit is issued.
- Final decision date begins 15-day appeal period.

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Buist Mine Modification Proposal

- Allston Farrell, LLC
 proposes to modify the
 Buist Mine by
 reallocating 12.7 acres of
 permitted buffer to
 affected acreage
- Mine site is located 1.5 northeast of the town of Hollywood
- Mine would be reclaimed as ponds and grassland
- No other changes proposed at this time

Affected acres	23.2	35.9	+12.7
Buffered acres	51.5	38.4	-12.7
Total acres	74.3	74.3	0



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
