DESCRIPTION:

The following position is offered as a field placement through the Region IV Public Health Training Center (<https://r4phtc.org/>).

Note: A hybrid option may be available for this placement.

POSITION DESCRIPTION:

This internship experience is designed to provide an opportunity for the student to interact with public health professionals, participate in activities related to community health and apply public health theory in real world scenarios. The student will gain experience using relevant technology in healthcare and increase understanding of cultural competency, confidentiality, and diversity in healthcare.

The student will be working in the Rabies/Vector control program at the Conway County Health Department. During the experience, the student will have the opportunity to develop an improvement project within the region that identifies a problem, presents an extensive literature review on the problem, collect, and analyze data to describe the extent of the problem, propose an intervention or plan to improve based on the evidence gathered from the literature review and findings from data analysis, and develop an implementation and evaluation plan. The student will present the project to the internship preceptor and team at the conclusion of the internship period.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- Excellent verbal and written communication skills
- Personal initiative
- Familiarity with Microsoft programs (Word/Excel/Outlook/PowerPoint/SharePoint/Teams)

THE STUDENT WILL HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO ASSIST WITH THE FOLLOWING ACTIVITIES:

- Build presentation for external partners in “data walks” designed to inform/educate regarding risks of exposure and importance of treatment
- Work with case managers to understand contact investigations and follow up
- Create initiatives to increase awareness and involvement in rabies vaccine clinic in rural and underserved areas
- Train with local staff in sample methods and processes while building understanding of the risks of vector borne diseases.
- Work with team to build simple training materials and create initiatives to recruit local volunteers to participate in sample collection.

To be eligible to apply for this position, you must be either a U.S. citizen, a non-citizen U.S. national, or a foreign national having in your possession a visa permitting permanent residence in the U.S.

QUALIFICATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS TO APPLY:

Preference will be given to masters or doctoral level public health graduate students. Will also consider undergraduate public health students (juniors/seniors) and part-time students (graduate). Students must complete the program prior to graduation. [Past recipients of the Pathways to Practice Award are not eligible to apply again.](#)

 - Citizenship or permanent resident visa status
- Please include a resume with the following:
 - The name and department of your degree program
 - Year of study
 - Expected graduation date
- Please also include the following with your application:
 - Brief summary of your learning objectives and goals for the internship

AWARD LEVEL: \$3,500 award

* Note: Travel costs will not be covered by the program beyond the total \$3,500 award.

APPROXIMATE HOURS PER WEEK & DURATION: Approximately 30 hours a week for 10-20 weeks.
