Triennial Review

- R.61-68: Water Classifications & Standards
 - Cadmium (aal), Enterococci (rec), carbaryl (aal), mycrocystins & cyclindrospermopsin (rec); calc method for metals criteria
- R.61-69: Classified Waters
 - Clarifications & corrections
- R.61-9: Water Pollution Control Permits
 - Adoption of portions of 3 Federal CWA rules required for State implementation

Western Capacity Use Area

- Aiken, Allendale, Bamberg, Barnwell, Calhoun, Lexington, Orangeburg
- GW Management Plan approved by DHEC Board on November 7

• >3MM gal/month ~~ permit



PFAS

- Strategy for Drinking Water (DRAFT)
- Target Issuance January 2020
 - Vulnerability Approach
- CWS (80%) ~~ Private Wells (20%)
- Surface Waters Strategy to follow in 2021



 Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA) [7 CFR 136] and the State Pesticide Control Act [SC Code of Laws 46-13]

 Applicable to water disinfection products in the permitting processes administered by SCDHEC.



Drinking Water

- approximately 278 existing and 700 new projects annually
- permits under the Federal Safe Drinking Water Act and State drinking water regulations

Wastewater

- approximately 740 existing and 250 new projects annually
- NPDES permits under the Federal Clean Water Act

Recreational Waters

- approximately 8,000 existing and 200 new pools annually
- State recreational waters regulations
