

Application Review Period for FEMA's Fiscal Year 2024 Fall National Dam Safety Program Rehabilitation of High Hazard Potential Dams Grant Extended Through May

The fiscal year 2024 fall application review period for the National Dam Safety Program (NDSP) Rehabilitation of High Hazard Potential Dams (HHPD) grant has been extended.

Pending additional delays, awards will be announced in late May or early June 2024, which will conclude Part 1 of the HHPD application process. The available amount for FY24 fall HHPD grants is approximately \$185 million, funded by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law. Post-award webinars will be held after the award notifications are complete.

The deadline to submit scope of work packages, or Part 2 of the process, was originally July 31, 2024, but will now be moved to late August or early September 2024 – depending upon when the awards are announced. More details will be released as soon as they are available.

Future HHPD grant funding amounts and dates have yet to be determined.
