Prior to his position at Nemours Children's Specialty Care, he served as Professor of Surgery at the University of Oklahoma Health Science Center. He is board certified in pediatric surgery and general surgery.

Dr. Letton is president of the Pediatric Trauma Society and a member of the American College of Surgeons Committee on Trauma. He is also affiliated with the American Pediatric Surgical Association, the Western Trauma Society, American Association for the Surgery of Trauma, Eastern Trauma Society and is a member of the Alpha Omega Alpha Medical Honor Society.
