


Watershed-based plans (WBP) identify pollutants in a watershed, determine the source of pollutants, and describe what needs to be done to address each source. Once a watershed-based plan is in place, it becomes the guidance and framework for any water quality improvement activities in that watershed.



Basic Eligibility Requirements:

- Cover a watershed with a drinking water intake or surface source water
- Cover one to four 12-digit HUCs
- Address surface water pollutants that impact source water for drinking water systems
